
### **Athletics**

## **Voters Meeting 1/18/26**

### **4th Quarter**

Chairman Richard Wardenburg called the meeting to order with 32 in attendance at 1:34pm. Pastor Zoske opened with a portion of Psalm 119 and prayer.

**Pastor:** Report included. Review of report - highlight of fantastic attendance numbers despite the number of self excluded members.

**Adoption of Voters Meeting Minutes:** Amendment for ballot for various boards not included. The need to transfer Richard Uhlmann to Richard Wardenburg in the Thrivent account requires proof of transfer. David Dellamuth motioned to approve. Kasey Garringer seconded.

**Review of official acts:** Down to 249 communicant members. Motion to approve official acts by Mike Ramsey. Richard Uhlmann seconded.

**Cemetery Fund:** Report included. Drop in interest from last quarter from 4% to 3.5%. A year from now it will re-up. Notified by the city that the city is considering refusing their yearly donations due to lack of funds - roughly \$900.

**Christian Service:** Report included. Discussed Christian Service and Evangelism to merge due to similar responsibilities and same members in each group - the two groups will discuss in writing and bring ideas to a meeting.

**Elders:** Report included. Down to 7 elders; 35-50 church members per elder.

**Evangelism:** Report included.

**Parish Ed:** Report included. Kids plan to create and send cards to shut-in members. Talk of getting a VBS program up and running this summer.

**Youth Group:** Report included. Average 12-20 kids from all four churches on Wednesday nights.

**Stewardship:** Report included. Statements went out last week.

**Trustees:** No report. Talk of changing insurance due to expenses. Talk of replacing sidewalks.

**LIS School Board:** Report included.

**Principal:** Report included. Registration opens soon for next school year. 3rd annual gala is scheduled for the end of April - goal is to finish off gym renovation with new bleachers that have railings. The band program is moving forward with improvements regarding a teacher and new instruments.

**Endowment Fund:** Report included. No comment.

**Treasurer:** Report included. Met the annual giving. Giving has dropped immensely this month so the funds will diminish quickly if giving does not go back up. Stewardship is working on doing pledge cards again to try and replenish funds. David Dellamuth motioned to file the treasurer's report for further financial review. Roger Bohrn seconded.

**Unfinished Business:** Trustees talked about a new sidewalk.

**New Business:**

- **LIS Proposed 2026/27 Budget:** Report included. Budget overall goes up a little over \$78,000 - board needs to discuss. General increases for food, insurance, etc. Salary increases follow district guidelines. Constitution states that numbers are based on December 1st numbers. Note: last time that we'll have an apportionment history portion - too confusing to follow. Will likely just have the previous year's numbers for comparison. Have 101 students for 25-26 school year - budget is based on 94 students for upcoming year.
- Asking if there is a way to increase tuition for nonmember students? Can't charge different rates - viewed as discrimination.

Motion to approve the proposed 2026-27 budget by Rhonett Wardenburg. Seconded David Delamuth.

- **St. Paul Lutheran Church Budget:** Report included. Bolded items are increased amounts. Cemetery fund budgeted down \$1k but since the city is thinking of not donating, talk of keeping \$2k for cemetery in budget. Motion to accept 2026 budget for St. Paul with an adjustment to include the 2026-27 approved budget amount and adjustments outlined by Rhonett Wardenburg. Seconded Mike Ramsey.
  - \*\*updated budget is included and has been approved.

Motion to approve the church budget by Rhonett Wardenburg. Seconded by Mike Ramsey.

- Nominations for President, first vice president and regional vice president. Recommending NOT to nominate president Harrison again due to needing to build momentum for a new cycle. Harrison has stated that this will be his last term serving. Recommending as follows per Pastor Zoske (and other pastors in the area):
  - For President: Reverend Benjamin Ball
  - First Vice-President: Reverend Peter Lange (current)
  - Regional Vice-President: Reverend David Ramirez

Motion to nominate the listed candidates for president, vice-president, and regional vice president by David Dellamuth. Seconded Lee Bair.

- **Richard Schaefer Matching Memorial Fund:** going with Cedar Point Capital Partners after looking into Hills, Edward Jones and Thrivent. Will be working with Trenton Von Ahsen about next steps. Estimating over 5% - cannot know for sure. Each fund will be managed differently.

- **Financial Task Force:** seeking more committee members to be involved. Taking individuals from committees to be able to discuss the investment part of things - make it more formalized to report back to the general congregation. Would include more people to make major decisions regarding money to take load off of the treasurer.

Motion to adjourn the meeting at 2:52pm by Bill Sitas. Seconded by Kasey Garringer.

Closed with the Lord's prayer.
