**Official Acts:** Overview of baptisms, confirmands, releases/deaths/transfers. Motion to adopt official acts by David Dellamuth, seconded Mike Ramsey. Approved.

**Principal Report:** Report included. Finishing up last year, there was an uptake in enrollment. Receiving positive feedback from ESA.

Pastor's Report: Report Included (unattached). Rose Fetzer to be added as a shut-in - in memory care unit.

Approved.* Can we use money from building fund to pay for property insurance? Never been done before, don't need push back from members. Property insurance involves the building. If approve to borrow from accounts, how will be repaid? People need to give joyfully in order to pay bills. No matter what, bills have to be paid first. *Motion to borrow against Thrivent savings account as needed to pay bills until line of credit is approved by Rhonett Wardenburg, seconded Monica Miller. Approved.* Motion to set treasurers report for further financial review by Eric Wardenburg, seconded by Mike Ramsey. Approved.

Unfinished Business: None.

**New Business:** Need to select a nominating committee. Volunteer: Kasey Garringer, Rhonett Wardenburg, Matt Schaefer, Brett Kozishek. Places to be filled will be listed in the bulletin.

*Financial Task Force*: due to church's financial issues - Nick Timm is chairman of this. Mainly the school board, elders, stewardship, Helen and Helen. Focus is to raise money and awareness of the current financial situation. Trying to find ways/encourage joyful giving and open to ideas anyone may have.
