7 "Christian" Rules That Every Christian Ought To Break As Often As Possible by Jonathan Fisk

Real Answers Real Religion Real Holy Spirituality

There are only two kinds of spirituality in the world. One is false, and one is true. One is the manifestation of the old evil foe who has sent many false spiritualties out into the world, and the other is the holy spirituality found only in faith in the one true God. One is a lie, and one is real. But which is which?
