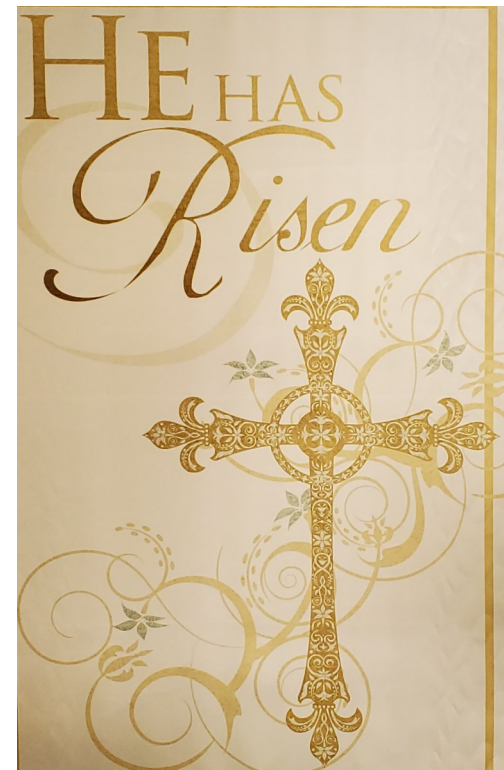

¹Now the apostles and the brothers who were throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles also had received the word of God. ²So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcision party criticized him, saying, ³“You went to uncircumcised men and ate with them.” ⁴But Peter began and explained it to them in order: ⁵“I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision, something like a great sheet descending, being let down from heaven by its four corners, and it came down to me. ⁶Looking at it closely, I observed animals and beasts of prey and reptiles and birds of the air. ⁷And I heard a voice saying to me, ‘Rise, Peter; kill and eat.’ ⁸But I said, ‘By no means, Lord; for nothing common or unclean has ever entered my mouth.’ ⁹But the voice answered a second time from heaven, ‘What God has made clean, do not call common.’ ¹⁰This happened three times, and all was drawn up again into heaven. ¹¹And behold, at that very moment three men arrived at the house in which we were, sent to me from Caesarea. ¹²And the Spirit told me to go with them, making no distinction. with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. ⁴He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning nor crying nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away.”

⁵And he who was seated on the throne said, “Behold, I am making all things new.” Also he said, “Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true.” ⁶And he said to me, “It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. LWML District Convention In Gathering June 10-11th. At the November, 2021 Board of Directors meeting, three different organizations were chosen as recipients for the district convention Gifts From The Heart.

The first is the House of Hope in Waterloo. This is a homeless shelter for single mothers with children. These families can stay here for up to 2 years while they work to regain their independence. Here is a list of items they would welcome to help the families living there: dish soap, dish drain racks, 4 x 6 area rugs, shower curtain liners, magnetic hooks, command hooks, Dollar General gift cards in \$10 denominations, quarters for coin laundry, and board games for all ages.

The second is in the Northeast Iowa Food Bank. Over the past two years many families' resources have been stretched and food banks have been a tremendous help in expanding their budgets. Non perishable food items such as canned fruits and vegetables, cereal, peanut butter, canned meats, and more will be welcomed.

The third is Valley Lutheran School in Cedar Falls. Schools, teachers and students have had many challenges over the past two years. School supplies such as pencils, dry erase markers and copy paper would be welcome.
