

Dear Fellow Members:

"I will give to the Lord the thanks due to his righteousness, and I will sing praise to the name of the Lord, the Most High" – Psalm 7:17

By the grace of God, we have been blessed with a generous gift from our late brother in Christ, Richard Schaefer. In accordance with his final wishes, we have established a memorial fund to continue the annual December matching gift program. All December donations to St. Paul's operating expenses—including the general fund and mission donations—will be matched at a rate of 50 cents for every dollar received, up to \$100,000 in contributions. This means matching funds could total \$50,000, for a potential combined impact of \$150,000. In response to this outpouring of thanks to God, our gifts to the Lord's work are immeasurable.

The Stewardship Board is setting a goal of \$100,000 in December donations in order to maximize the benefits of this gift. This is many times the normal monthly giving total.
